UPDATE—COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS) CLOSURE: MESSAGE FROM FR GERARDO: As of May 1, there are updated guidelines for congregations in the Episcopal Diocese of Arizona. For now, we are holding in-person worship services on **SUNDAY ONLY**.

- Masks and social distancing continue to be required at all church functions.
- Congregational and choral singing can resume after May 1.
- Coffee hour and other functions with food can take place outdoors after May 1 (but not indoors).
- Worship and other events can take place with up to 50% of the capacity of the room being used.
- All cleaning and sanitizing procedures will be carried out before and after each service in the sanctuary as well as any common areas like the narthex and restrooms.

- Parishioners are further encouraged to bring their own copies of a BCP, bible and/or hymnal, if desired. The powerpoint will still be available and have everything you need on the screen.
